# THE SEDDON LEGACY PROJECT

Here for the bereaved children of Northamptonshire. Easy, simple, social support for the benefit of their future. A monthly peer support group, a befriending service & more.

## WHAT IS A "FUNERAL FRIEND?"



Experiencing a bereavement can be a complex and challenging time for anyone and especially for children.

Mostly, parents, guardians or relatives who have been bereaved make the decision for children to not attend the funeral. This can be for many different reasons and is a choice to be made when there are children concerned.

the most comammon reasons for this choice are:

- Too traumatic
- Too many sad people, people visibly upset or in distress
- Too long to sit in one place and quietly



The Funeral Friend is someone who can support families and bereaved children to attend the farewell of their loved one. The funeral friend can support with decision making, speaking to a child about a funeral and the process to gain a better understanding to make their own choice.

the funeral friend will attend the service in any way the family decide. It can be maximum support alongside the child, or in the background there if needed.

The funeral friend provides an opportunity for children to come away in the service gets too much for them and / or give moral support throughout. More information for parents / carers and professional staff within the funeral industry.


# BEREAVEMENT BEFRIENDER

The Bereavement Befriender is a scheme that has just launched and is proving to be successful for bereaved families for their children.

It consists of the befriender attending the childs school to provide social support. (Counselling or therapeutic intervention not available)

It would be recommended that the befriender would visit the child in some capacity before the funeral to build, trust and rappor to achieve the aims of a Funeral Friend.

\*Please note some schools across Northamptonshire cannot endorse the befriending scheme. In their setting. If this is the case, we can arrange an external session.



# DECISION MAKING

#### What age is suitable to attend a funeral?

The answer to this is very complex. Various ages, and the childs experiences are individual to them therefore it is a difficult decision to make.

#### How do you explain a funeral to a child?

This is an extremely difficult task especially when you, the adult is grieving too. There are so many rescources available to support with these conversations. Please check out the signposting page of this document.

#### My child understands, they have decided not to, what if they change their mind?

As with any choice especially in this regard, the option must be kept open for the child to have the possibility to change their mind. Aslong as they are equipped with sincere and accurate information, the choice is theirs to make.



#### **Break the Stigma**

Children have as much right to attend a funeral as every other person who attends.

Children see the world differently and their level of understanding is usually age appropriate.

For years, funerals have been a place where children are deemed to not be. For many, along the line this creates an empty gap within the narrative for their grieving process.

At the Seddon legacy project- we are set to change this.




